

Using PureAudio Live Recorder With Dragon NaturallySpeaking

Recordings made with PureAudio Live Recorder on the iPhone can be transcribed using Dragon NaturallySpeaking.

Dragon NaturallySpeaking (DNS)

A version of Dragon NaturallySpeaking that supports use with a digital voice recorder, such as, the Preferred Edition is required.

See the Dragon NaturallySpeaking documentation for information about how to use it with a digital voice recorder.

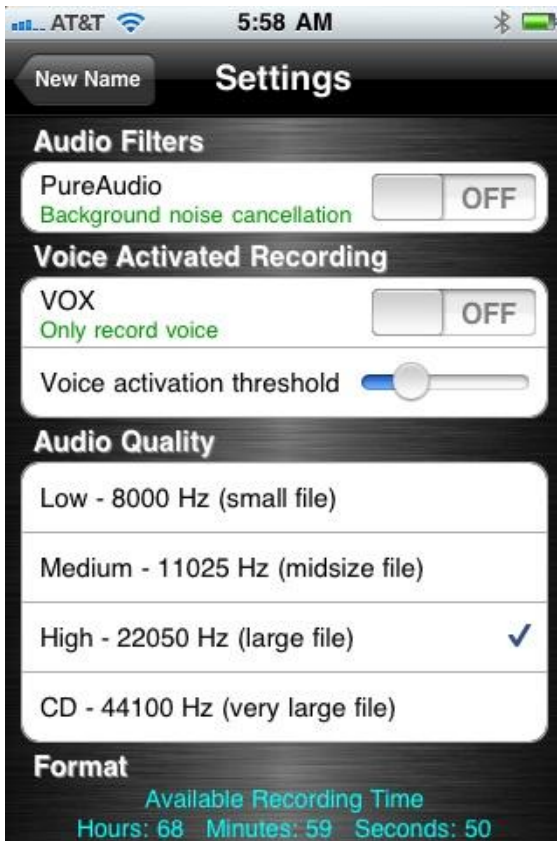

PureAudio Live Recorder Settings

Before you can use DNS to transcribe recordings, you need to train DNS. Training involves making a long recording in PureAudio Live by reading the training text supplied by DNS, then transferring the recording to DNS so it can finish the training process.

The recommended settings in PureAudio Live Recorder for creating the training recording are:

PureAudio (Background noise cancellation): OFF
VOX (Only record voice): OFF
Audio Quality: High – 22050 Hz
Format: WAVE



The recommended settings for making the recordings to be transcribed are:

PureAudio (Background noise cancellation): ON or OFF

VOX (Only record voice): OFF

Audio Quality: Medium – 11025 Hz or High – 22050 Hz

Format: WAVE

Transferring Recordings

The recordings need to be transferred to the computer hosting DNS. Transferring the training recording and any other large recordings needs to be done using the Wi-Fi Sync feature in PureAudio Live Recorder. Small recordings can optionally be transferred using the email feature.
